1879	G. F. Hunt	?	?	Prominent local doctor in West Bend. Was involved in a violent altercation between himself and L. F. Frisby during the election.

1882	Fred H. Haase	131	59.81%	Local saloon owner (businessman)
	John Potter Jr.	88	40.18%	All write in votes. Would later become the last village president in 1884 and the first West Bend mayor in 1885.
1883	Samuel S. Barney	84	47.20%	First president of the West Bend Mutual Fire Insurance Company. Registered Republican. Practiced law with L. F. Frisby. Representative for Washington County in Congress (1895 - 1903). Judge on the Court of Claims appointed by President Theodore Roosevelt (1905 - 1919)
	John Shelley	94	52.80%	Member of the Washington County Board. Washington County Judge (1857 - 1881). First Village president of West Bend (1868 - 1870). Lawyer
